A few reminders that parents can help the school with to make each day run smooth.

1. Please complete the student self-certification EACH day for your child. This MUST be done as a layer of safety to ensure students are coming to school healthy. If your child IS not feeling well, please keep them home.
2. Remind your student to assist the school by maintaining 6 feet of social distancing, especially at the end of the day. Students NOT eating lunch at the high school are allowed to leave at 12:30. Students waiting for the bus are asked to self-monitor their distance between classmates outdoors, when face coverings are not mandated.
